**Amundi reaffirms its commitment to women in golf with its third
Amundi Golf Team**

Paris, January 30th, 2026 – Amundi, Europe's leading asset manager¹, today unveiled third cohort of the Amundi European Golf Team, a team of promising young female players supported by the Group. Launched in 2021, this programme aims to provide financial support to young female golfers while promoting their career development through greater visibility and access to various sporting opportunities.

The Amundi team welcomes two new players: Nastasia Nadaud (France) and Mimi Rhodes (England) for 2026-2028. They join four players from previous cohorts: Alexandra Försterling (Germany), Sara Kouskova (Czech Republic), Sayaka Takahashi (Japan) and Lauren Walsh (Ireland).

Since its creation, the program has supported 25 players from Germany, the United States, China, France, Japan, Switzerland, Taiwan, Thailand and the Czech Republic. This programme reflects Amundi's commitment to providing equal opportunities and promoting diversity. With the 2026-2028 cohort, Amundi also continues to support talent from countries where the Group operates.

Mimi Rhodes commented: *"I am excited to partner with Amundi and join their team of player ambassadors. They have been a huge supporter of women's golf for many years and are very committed to growing the game. Through their events and talent programme they are providing players with many opportunities and promoting women's golf on a global"*

Nastasia Nadaud, Lauren Walsh and Mimi Rhodes have qualified for the Ladies Professional Golf Association Tour (LPGA Tour), the world's leading women's golf tour, which takes place in the United States. In addition, Sara Kouskova, Mimi Rhodes and Nastasia Nadaud have been selected to compete in The Amundi Evian Championship, which will be held from 9 to 12 July 2026.

- **Nastasia Nadaud, France**

Nastasia started playing golf at the age of 6. She competed in her first national tournament at the age of 11.

She turned professional at 18 and gained direct entry to the 2023 Ladies European Tour. Nastasia improved her ranking over the next two seasons, finishing 23rd in the 2024 Order of Merit and 3rd in 2025. After three seasons on the LET, Nastasia has competed in 71 tournaments, finishing 13 times in the top 10.

She led the LET birdie rankings in 2025 and ended her 2025 season by winning the Spanish Open in Andalusia. In 2026, Nastasia will play on the American LPGA Tour.

- **Mimi Rhodes (England)**

Mimi was born in Bath, Somerset, and started playing golf at the age of 8. She had a successful amateur career, representing England and being part of the historic 2024 Curtis Cup winning team, which defeated the United States in spectacular fashion. She spent four years at Wake Forest University, where she earned NCAA All American honours.

Since turning professional immediately after the Curtis Cup, she won her second appearance on the LET Access Tour at the Lavaux Ladies Open. She then won the Aramco Team Series Team Award in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, on her LET debut.

Her first victory on the Ladies European Tour came at the Ford Women's NSW Open on only her second appearance on the LET. She went on to win two more victories, propelling her to an impressive second place in the final rankings. She also won the Rookie of the Year title. This most impressive season was crowned by Mimi earning her full LPGA playing rights for 2026. The coming year is sure to be an exciting one, with the Solheim Cup on the horizon.

- **Alexandra Försterling (Germany)**

Alexandra Foersterling is a German professional golfer and the reigning champion of the 2024 Amundi German Masters.

Formerly ranked No. 9 in the world amateur rankings, Alexandra turned professional in September 2022. She immediately caused a sensation in her first Ladies European Tour (LET) tournament in Switzerland, finishing in an impressive 4th place. At the end of 2022, she won (tied) the final stage of LET Q-School, securing her card for the 2023 season of the Ladies European Tour, the highest level of European women's golf.

Alexandra's 2023 season, her first as a professional, was nothing short of spectacular: in September, she claimed her first professional victory at the VP Bank Swiss Ladies Open. Barely two months later, she made headlines again by winning the Mallorca Ladies Open, securing her second LET title. She concluded her impressive first season by finishing second in the LET Rookie of the Year rankings and eighth in the LET Race to Costa del Sol rankings. In addition, she secured a place on the LPGA Tour for the 2024 season through Q-School.

In February 2024, Alexandra won her third LET title at the Aramco Team Series in Tampa, Florida, after only ten starts on the tour. Three months later, she claimed her fourth LET victory at the Amundi German Masters in her hometown of Berlin. This triumph propelled her to second place in the LET Order of Merit and saw her break into the top 60 in the world rankings (58th).

Thanks to her outstanding performances, Alexandra qualified for the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris and represented the German team. Just two weeks later, she was named as a reserve player for the European team for the 2024 Solheim Cup. She finished the 2024 season in an excellent 10th place in the LET Order of Merit.

- **Sará Kousková, Czech Republic**

Sara began her professional golfing career on the Ladies European Tour Access Series, where she finished first in the rankings.

This earned her her Ladies European Tour card for the 2023 season. She claimed her first professional victory at the Santander Golf Tour Malaga, two more wins on the LETAS and a runner-up finish at the Amundi Czech Ladies Challenge in 2022.

Sara was born in Karlovy Vary and played golf at the Prague City Golf Club. She pursued a collegiate golf career at the University of Texas.

- **Sayaka Takhashi, Japan**

Sayaka started playing golf at the age of 10 and gradually made a name for herself, winning the Japan Women's Amateur Golf Championship in 2016 by beating many renowned competitors. She turned professional in 2018.

In 2022, she claimed her first victory on the tour at the Fuji Sankei Ladies. In 2024, she performed well, finishing in the top ten 15 times. She claimed her second victory at the Miyazato Ai Suntory Ladies Open Golf Tournament in 2025.

- **Lauren Walsh, Ireland**

Lauren started playing golf at the age of 10 with her older sister at her local club in Castlewarden, Ireland. At 18, she earned a golf scholarship to Wake Forest University, where she studied mathematics and became a Wake Forest Scholar Athlete. She is now an ambassador for the [Annika Foundation](#) after a successful amateur career that saw her compete in the Curtis Cup, the Youth Olympic Games and the US university circuit.

Lauren turned professional in the summer of 2023 and achieved Category 16 status on the LET in 2024. In 2026, Lauren will play on the American LPGA Tour.
